| Minimum Number of Credits Required | Students are expected to participate in full-time enrollment. Undergraduates must enroll in minimum of 12 credits or at least 4 courses per a semester. Graduate students must enroll in 9 credits or 3 courses. Of these, up to three credits (one course) could be virtual and the rest must be in person or hybrid. |
| English Proficiency | Students who are native English speakers or who attend a university where English is the language of instruction are exempt from English placement exams. Graduate students must qualify using the ELTS or TOEFL requirements only. Applicants must meet one of the following: -(TOEFL): 80 or higher with no subsection score less than 16. NOTE: TOEFL iBT Special Home Edition is accepted. TOEFL iBT "My Best' combined scores, TOEFL Essentials Test, and TOEFL ITP Plus are not accepted. GRAD-90 or higher -Cambridge Assessment: English score of 176 or higher |
